


Kansas eCourt: CCMS Project Update (3-10-23)



Track 10 courts go-live date is April 3

District courts in Track 10 are scheduled to start using the Kansas eCourt case management system April 3. Track 10 includes three counties and three judicial districts.

Courts in Track 10 are:

• 3rd Judicial District: Shawnee County

• 7th Judicial District: Douglas County

29th Judicial District: Wyandotte County

TOGA wallet accounts

To pay filing fees to courts operating on the Kansas eCourt case management system, you must set up a TOGA wallet account under your user profile in the <u>Kansas Courts</u> <u>eFiling system</u>.

You must set up your account before you can begin to pay filing fees through the efiling

system when you file in courts operating on the Kansas eCourt case management system.

Courts in Track 10 will require a TOGA wallet account for efiling payments beginning April 3.

Track 10 go-live impact on courts in Tracks 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6

There will be minimal impact to courts in Tracks 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6 when data from Track 10 courts is added to the Kansas eCourt case management system.

From **5 p.m. Friday, March 31** to **8 a.m. Monday, April 3**, the Kansas eCourt case management system will be offline for courts in Tracks 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6. The courts will not accept electronic filings or electronic payments.

The <u>Kansas District Court Public Access Portal</u> will not be able to retrieve case data from these courts during this time.

- 4th Judicial District: Anderson, Coffey, Franklin, and Osage counties

- 6th Judicial District: Bourbon, Linn, and Miami counties
- 8th Judicial District: Dickinson, Geary, Marion, and Morris counties
- 9th Judicial District: McPherson and Harvey counties
- 11th Judicial District: Cherokee, Crawford, and Labette counties
- 12th Judicial District: Cloud, Jewell, Lincoln, Mitchell, Republic, and Washington counties
- 13th Judicial District: Butler, Elk, and Greenwood counties
- 14th Judicial District: Chautauqua and Montgomery counties
- 15th Judicial District: Cheyenne, Logan, Rawlins, Sheridan, Sherman, Thomas, and Wallace counties
- 16th Judicial District: Clark, Comanche, Ford, Gray, Kiowa, and Meade counties
- 17th Judicial District: Decatur, Graham, Norton, Osborne, Phillips, and Smith counties
- 19th Judicial District: Cowley County
- 20th Judicial District: Barton, Ellsworth, Rice, Russell, and Stafford counties
- 21st Judicial District: Clay and Riley counties

- 22nd Judicial District: Brown, Doniphan, Marshall, and Nemaha counties
- 23rd Judicial District: Ellis, Gove, Rooks, and Trego counties

Track 10 go-live schedule

To prepare Track 10 courts to convert from FullCourt to the Kansas eCourt case management system, courts in Track 10 must stop taking filings and payments made electronically.

<u>Supreme Court Administrative Order 2023-CC-010</u> establishes the conversion schedule for Track 10, which begins at **2 p.m. Wednesday, March 29**, and ends at **8 a.m. Monday, April 3**.

The conversion schedule is:

Wednesday, March 29

At 2 p.m., courts in the 3rd Judicial District and 29th Judicial District will stop taking electronic filings. Courts in the 7th Judicial District will stop taking electronic filings at 4 p.m. All Track 10 courts will stop accepting electronic payments at 5 p.m.

Thursday, March 30, and Friday, March 31

Track 10 courts will be open and operating during regular business hours and accepting paper filings. Payments must be made in cash or by paper check.

Monday, April 3

At 8 a.m., Track 10 courts are fully operating on the eCourt case management system and electronic filing and electronic payments resume.

Supreme Court Rules 20–25

Unless otherwise indicated, these rules apply to courts as they are brought onto the

Kansas eCourt case management system. They require the filer to correctly designate the case and document type. They also require the filer to indicate if the document complies with Rule 24 protecting personally identifiable information or if it is filed under seal.

These rules are necessary to protect individuals' personally identifiable information as district court records are made accessible through the public access portal as part of the Kansas eCourt case management system.

Supreme Court Rules 20–25 are known as the <u>Kansas eCourt rules</u> and they can be found on the <u>Search Rules page</u>.

Future tracks

Track 9, which is the 18th Judicial District (Sedgwick County), has an anticipated go-live date of August 7.

Only two other tracks remain in the project. One covers appellate courts (Track 7) and the other the 10th Judicial District (Track 8). Appellate courts will transition in 2023 on a date yet to be announced. The 10th Judicial District is not yet scheduled.

The <u>Statewide Rollout Plan</u> is updated as new information becomes available.
